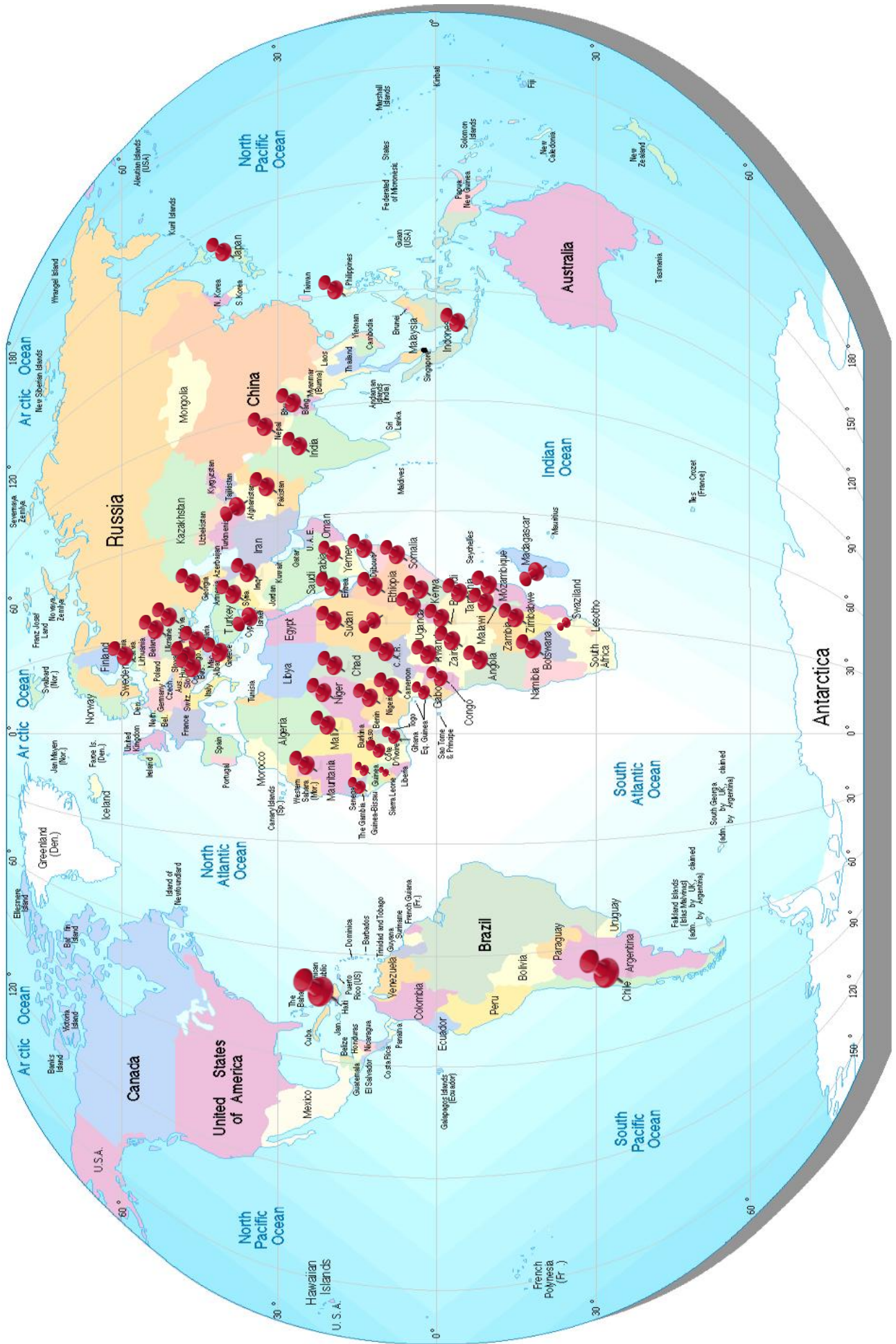

# INTRODUCTION

## “Heart Doctors”: Identity and humanitarian activities

During the war against Yugoslavia, a few volunteering friends from Greece decided to assist the attacked people by gathering medicines, food provisions and other necessary items, which they transported by car and offered to the victims of that war.

Thus, an informal group of Greek doctors and other friends was formed at that time, which soon began offering humanitarian assistance initially to very poor African communities. They used to offer medical services, medicines and food to populations living in remote or isolated rural areas, ill and forgotten, without any medical care. The members of that group created in 2001 the Humanitarian Organization “Heart Doctors”.

“Heart Doctors” is a Greek, Humanitarian, Non Profit, Non-Governmental Organization of volunteers. Their main task is to provide health care (medical camps), medicines, food, and other supplies free of charge in emergency situations where human health and life are faced with imminent danger. This happens in case of war conflicts, massive violent movements of people (refugees and internal massive and violent movements and dislocation of populations), epidemics, natural disasters (earthquakes, hurricanes and cyclones, floods and tsunamis, major fires) and hunger due to prolonged drought or other reasons.

“Heart Doctors” offer also free medical care and necessary medicines to populations they visit in remote areas where there are no doctors and hospitals. As far as possible, they also try to secure economic resources to finance small or larger projects such as rural medical centers, hospitals, drinking water supply, school buildings, orphanages, libraries, etc.

To date, **1.694** missions have been accomplished in **79** countries of Africa, Asia, Europe and America. These missions have covered the need of assistance of all the above-mentioned forms. “Heart Doctors” were actively present in various wars and events of war (in Iraq, Lebanon, the Gaza Strip, Afghanistan, Pakistan, Syria and Libya), in earthquakes (in Iran, Haiti, Chile, Indonesia, Nepal), in the case of tsunamis (Sri Lanka, Indonesia, Japan), floods (India, Bangladesh, Myanmar and the Balkans), in cyclones in the Philippines, India, Bangladesh, Malawi, Mozambique and Zimbabwe; they have offered food relief in Sudan (Darfur and Khartoum), the republic of Niger, Ethiopia, Kenya, Somalia, Djibouti, Eritrea, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Madagascar, Mozambique, Guinea Bissau, India. Construction projects have been accomplished in Sri Lanka, Burundi, Nigeria, Kenya, Ghana and Cameroon.

In Greece, many missions have been carried out to deal with devastating events such as earthquakes, major fires and floods. There has also been assistance to provincial hospitals and to very poor families of homeless and uninsured people. In Koutsohera village of Ilia, which was partially destroyed by the big fires of 2007, the construction of a building was financed to house the kindergarten of the village.

“Heart Doctors” function on a genuine voluntary basis, without any employees. Members and associates as well as friends offer their services and everything else they can, without any reward. Any form of assistance offered by “Heart Doctors” is given free of charge and without distinctions of color, nation, caste and religion.

The missions of the Organization are carried out by teams of members who visit the patients in the places where they live (settlement, tropical forest, savannah, camp, natural disaster area). Medicines and other forms of assistance are provided directly by “Heart Doctors” themselves, not by intermediaries. The teams who participate in the missions cover themselves all their relevant expenses.

## ACTIVITIES IN 2025

### Countries and Missions

During the year 2025, “Heart Doctors” assisted **27** countries (including Greece).

The total number of countries that have accepted humanitarian assistance from “Heart Doctors” up to now, are **88**.

In foreign countries, **8** missions for medical services, **9** missions for delivery of medicines, **24** missions for food distribution and **11** missions for provision of other necessary-supplies were carried out.

In Greece, **36** missions were accomplished during the year 2025 which included provincial hospitals and schools.

### Construction Projects

During the year 2025, two rural medical centers were inaugurated in Niger State in Nigeria.

The first is at Gusun Village (Gurara Local Government Area) and the second in the village of Kakpi (Agaie Local Government Area).

“Heart Doctors” warmly thank all those who in any way contributed to the humanitarian work of the Organization.







# MISSIONS FOR MEDICAL SERVICES

Five Sub-Saharan African countries were visited during 2025 to carry out eight humanitarian missions and offer medical services to populations living in remote rural areas. These countries and the number of missions for each of them are shown in the following table:

A short description follows for each mission in chronological order of their accomplishment.



## Nigeria – Niger State

A four-member team of “Heart Doctors” departed from Athens on Thursday 23.1.2025, for Nigeria.

On 25.1.2025, the team set off by road, travelling over rough roads, to visit the village of Gusun (Gurara Local Government Area) for the inauguration of the rural clinic. In the last mission, the team requested that the old dilapidated clinic be demolished and a new one be built to meet the needs of the residents of the village and the surrounding area. The clinic consists of a delivery room, a nursing room and a doctor’s office. The inauguration was attended by a large crowd of people and the Emir of the region. At the same time, free medical care was provided. The team spent the night there.

The villages visited by the team during the next three days are listed below.

Gydna village - Tafa Local Government Area

IDP Camp, Kuta - Shiroro Local Government Area

Filikin village - Bosso Local Government Area

Pangu village - Bosso Local Government Area

In the local community of Kuta, the internally displaced immigrants of the camp were examined, milk was given to the infants and 10 bags of rice of 100 kg for the nutrition of the families.

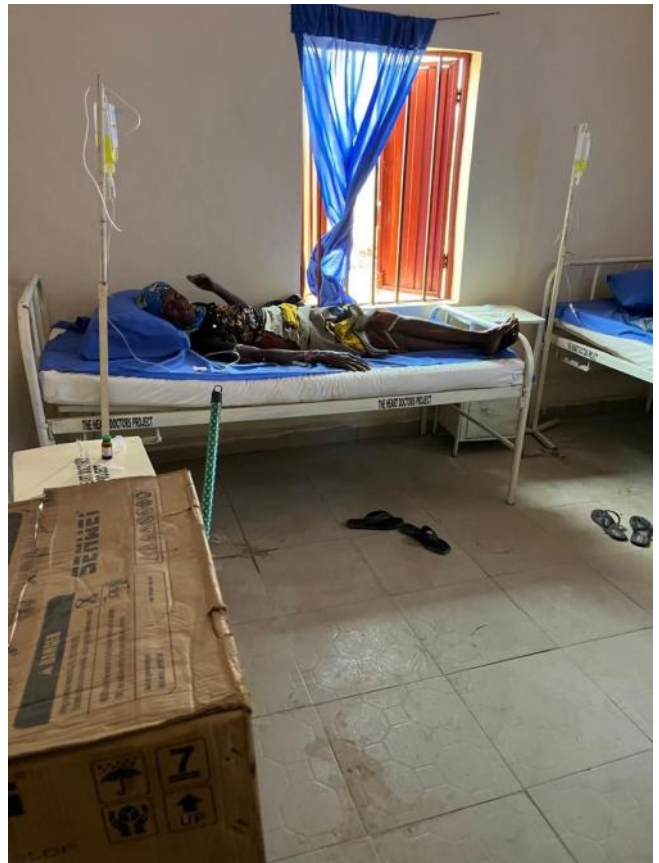
On 28.1.2025, the team offered free medical care in the village near the town of Pinda and later traveled by road late at night to the “Golden Sugar Estate” FMN Koumantaros Group Companies, Sunti, Mokwa, Niger State, invited by the General Manager of Mr. Anlo du Pisani and his wife Tamara.

For the next two days, the team offered free medical services at the premises of the Sunti clinic of the “Sunti Golden Sugar Estate” unit. In addition to the employees of the company's complex, crowds of patients who were transported by the company's trucks from the villages of the wider area to Sunti were examined and received medication.

Main diseases:

Malaria, parasites, arthralgias, hypertension, skin diseases, gastroenteritis, urinary tract infections, upper respiratory tract infections, conjunctivitis, anemia and children with malnutrition.





### North Cameroon, Katrang

On 8.2.2025, a four-member team of the “Heart Doctors” departed to Chad.

At noon of the same day, the team set off by road and after five hours of rough dirt road, arrived at the village of Bongor at night, where they crossed the river over to Cameroon.

After customs formalities and with the guidance of Father Irine, who knew the labyrinth of provincial roads, they set off by road, passing through difficult dirt roads to arrive after two hours late at night in the isolated village of Katrang.

For the next five days, the team offered free medical services, examining all those who came every day at the premises of the Church of the St. Apostle.

Main diseases:

Malaria (where injectable treatment was required), parasites, upper respiratory infections, schistosomiasis, arthralgias, urinary tract infections, gastroenteritis, conjunctivitis. Neglected lower limb wounds in poor condition that were cleaned daily and given antibiotics, anemia, malnutrition of a few infants, mastitis in nursing mothers, epilepsy, hypertension, diabetes.





# 15th mission

30/05/2025

## Kenya

A five-member team of “Heart Doctors”, departed from Athens on Friday 30.5.2025, to Kenya.

Invited by the polytechnic school of Bible College, “Heart Doctors” offered free medical services at the school in Thika district.

In the following days, the team offered medical services to the people of villages Kimende, Ewaso Kendong, Riruta and Nakuru based at the monastery in Riruta area where they were guests of Bishop Makarios. These specific villages had a school, dispensary and church. Where it was deemed necessary, pharmaceutical material was donated to meet the needs of the residents.

On the last day, 12.6.2025, the team visited the area where people of the Masai tribe reside and examined them.

### Main diseases:

Back pain, arthralgia, hypertension, eye and dental diseases, gastroenteritis, upper respiratory infections, skin diseases. Malaria did not exist due to the time period.





# 1st mission

31/08/2025

## South Sudan

A four-member team of “Heart Doctors” departed from Athens on Sunday 31.8.2025 for South Sudan. With a stopover in Cairo, the team arrived the next day in the capital of South Sudan, Juba.

South Sudan is the newest country in the world, which was declared independent in 2011 and is plagued by a generalized humanitarian crisis. A very beautiful country, with kind and suffering people, warmly welcomed the team and upon hearing about their origins they were touched, as their ancestors and first immigrants who settled in Juba, at the request of the then unified Sudan, were Greeks. This event filled the team with pride and emotion, proving once again that wherever Greeks are, they are welcome and everywhere there is a piece of our homeland and history hidden.

According to senior officials of South Sudan, “Heart Doctors” is the first Greek organization to enter the country since its creation, to provide free medical assistance in isolated areas where people live in real need and do not have access to a hospital or doctor.

During the mission, “Heart Doctors” visited the following locations around the capital of Juba:

2/9/25: Meetings with senior officials of the country, representatives of the President and the First Lady, as well as a visit to the Ministry of National Defense

3/9/25: Medical camp in New Bongo

4/9/25: Medical camp in Nyin Anyar

5/9/25: Medical camp in Gure Residential Area and Hai Referendum Residential Area

6/9/25: Medical camp in Mapau

7/9/25: Medical camp in Jebel Dinka

Main diseases:

Malaria, anemia, gastroenteritis, upper respiratory tract infection, skin diseases, eye diseases, back pain, arthralgia, parasites and gastroenteritis.





## Nigeria - Niger State

A six-member team of "Heart Doctors" departed from Athens on Wednesday, 17.9.2025, for Nigeria. With a stopover and overnight stay in Cairo, the team arrived the next day at noon in the capital of Nigeria, Abuja, and immediately departed by road to Minna.

The team was informed about the progress of the housing construction project for the homeless displaced refugees.

Over the next four days, the team traveled by road through difficult roads to provide medical assistance to the following remote villages around the city of Minna:

19/9 Madabia Village, Shiroro Local Government Area, Niger State

20/9 Kakpi Village, Agaie Local Government Area, Niger State

21/9 Jere Gari Village, Paikoro Local Government Area, Niger State

22/9 Kinbokun Village, Mokwa Local Government Area, Niger State

"Heart Doctors" team visited the village of Kakpi (Agaie Local Government Area) for the inauguration of the rural clinic. The clinic consists of a delivery room, a nursing room and an examination room.

On 22/9 at noon, the team departed by road from Kinbokun village for Sunti where they settled following the invitation of the General Manager "Golden Sugar Estate" FMN Koumantaros Group Companies, Mr. Anlo du Pisani and his wife Tamara, offering medical services for three days at the Sunti clinic of the "Sunti Golden Sugar Estate" unit. In addition to the employees of the company complex, crowds of patients who were transported by the company's trucks from the villages of the wider area of Sunti were examined and received free medication.

### Main diseases:

Malaria, anemia, upper respiratory tract infections, parasites, skin diseases, otitis, conjunctivitis, urinary tract infections, arthralgias, back pain, chronically infected wounds.

Newborn babies were malnourished due to the mothers' ignorance were fed with water instead of breast milk.





## Nigeria - Jigawa State

A five-member team of "Heart Doctors" departed from Athens on Wednesday 22nd of October 22, 2025, for Nigeria. The mission arrived the next morning in Kano city in northern Nigeria, the capital of Kano State. There, they were welcomed by representatives of the Jigawa state Government, who accompanied them by road to the capital, Dutse.

That same evening, the team visited the Health Commissioner. He explained to them how the health system works in the wider region. "Heart Doctors" proposed to work in remote areas where villagers do not have access to a clinic or hospital to cover their needs.

Over the next five days, the team traveled by road to the following remote villages to offer medical and pharmaceutical assistance.

24/10 Madobi, Settlement Dutse, Local Government Area, Jigawa State

25/10 Rakwata, Settlement Kaugama, Local Government Area, Jigawa State

26/10 Durbe, Settlement Yankwashi, Local Government Area, Jigawa State

27/10 Dan Banki, Settlement Sule Tankarkar, Local Government Area, Jigawa State

28/10 Digawar Hausawa, Settlement Ringim, Local Government Area, Jigawa State

At the end of the free medical camp, the Governor of Jigawa State invited "Heart Doctors" to his office in the presence of the ministers, offering "honorary recognition" to the team's work, which contributed significantly to the health of residents in remote villages.

### Main diseases:

Malaria, tracheobronchitis, gastroenteritis, otitis, conjunctivitis, skin diseases, parasitic infections, low back pain - sciatica, hypertension, epilepsy, many chronic injuries. Malnourished children with below-average weight for their age.





# 37th mission

05/11/2025

## North Cameroon, Katrang

On 5.11.2025, a five-member team of "Heart Doctors" departed from Athens for Chad, with an overnight stop in Cairo.

The next day, upon arriving in N'Djamena, the team picked up their visas from the embassy and continued their journey by road to cross the border through Bongor.

It took them five hours to cross the river connecting Chad and Cameroon via the new bridge. Late at night, they had to change cars and arrived at the isolated village of Katrang at dawn, after traveling on rough roads.

For the next three days, the "Heart Doctors" team offered free medical services, examining everyone who came to the Holy Apostles Church every day and treating a variety of tropical diseases.

On 10.11.2025, the members of the mission began their return journey by road via the bridge, arriving in Bongor and, after a five-hour torturous drive, reaching the capital N'Djamena, where they spent the night.

### Main diseases:

Malaria, upper respiratory tract infections, gastroenteritis, urinary tract infections, arthralgia, back pain, conjunctivitis, otitis, skin diseases, several mothers did not have enough milk to breastfeed their babies and were given powdered milk.





## Burkina Faso

A five-member team of "Heart Doctors" departed from Athens on Friday, 21.11.2025, for Burkina Faso. With a stopover in Istanbul, the team arrived late in the evening in the capital of Burkina Faso, Ouagadougou.

In the following days, the team waited for the country's Customs to complete the inspection so that they could receive approval and be officially informed about the mission's program, which they would begin by providing medical assistance.

In the northern part of the country, there was intense activity by Anarchist Groups. As a result, medical assistance was not provided to remote villages for the safety of the team.

The Ministry of Health then informed "Heart Doctors" team about the needs of the General Hospital, where they donated medicines for children.





## MISSIONS FOR DELIVERY OF MEDICAMENTS

During the year 2025, **9** missions for delivery of medicaments were accomplished.



## FOOD MISSIONS

In the year 2025, **24** missions for food delivery were carried out in **11** countries, as shown in the following table:

**Djibouti:** Two missions were carried out in Djibouti. Rice, corn, flour and powder milk were distributed to poor families (11.1.2025, 25.6.2025).

**Eritrea:** Three missions were carried out where rice, corn, flour and powder milk were distributed to poor families (11.12.2025, 25.6.2025, 2.10.2025).

**Eswatini:** Two missions were carried out through Beira of Mozambique. Rice and flour were distributed to poor families (10.3.2025, 24.7.2025).

**India:** Two missions were carried out in South India in Andhra Pradesh State for providing dhal and rice to hungry villagers (19.2.2025, 14.11.2025).

**Mozambique:** Three missions carried out were distributed rice, flour and powder milk to starving families (11.1.2025, 10.3.2025, 24.7.2025).

**Niger:** Two missions were carried out through Abuja of Nigeria. Rice, flour, powder milk and drinking water were distributed to poor families (4.3.2025, 12.10.2025).

**Nigeria:** One mission was carried out to the local community of Kuta. Rice was distributed to the immigrants of a camp (4.3.2025).

**Somalia:** Two missions were carried out through Djibouti. Rice, corn, flour and powder milk were distributed to poor families (11.1.2025, 25.6.2025).

**Sudan:** One mission was carried out to Eritrea due to the war in Port-Sudan. Rice, powder milk and corn were distributed to refugees of the war in surrounding area (11.1.2025). Two more missions carried out in Darfur where milk, rice, flour and corn flour were distributed to poor families (25.6.2025, 2.10.2025).

**Zimbabwe:** Three missions were carried out through Beira of Mozambique. Rice, powder milk, flour and corn were distributed to poor families (11.1.2025, 10.3.2025, 24.7.2025).

**Palestine:** A mission was carried out through Alexandria of Egypt. Rice, flour, semolina and powder milk distributed as humanitarian assistance to the Palestinian people, injured in recent attacks by the Israeli Army (24.7.2025).

**Armenia:** A mission took place in the capital of Yerevan for providing to students clothes (winter jackets) and school material (pencils, notebooks, rulers, etc), (12.9.2025).

**Gambia:** A mission took place in town Banjul providing clothing and shoes to school children of poor families(30.4.2025).

**Georgia:** Three missions took place in town Gopi and the capital Tbilisi for providing to children of a kindergarten and to school students clothes and student material (pencils, notebooks, rulers, etc), (1.4.2025, 14.5.2025, 28.8.2025).

**Guinea:** A mission took place in town Konakri offering clothing and shoes to school children of poor families (30.4.2025).

**Liberia:** A mission took place in the capital of Monrovia where clothing and shoes were provided to school children (30.4.2025).

**Moldova:** Three missions took place in town Lapusna and in the capital Chisinau for providing clothes and student material (pencils, notebooks, rulers) to kindergarten and school students (1.4.2025, 14.5.2025,28.8.2025).

**Nigeria:** “Heart Doctors” contributed to the purchase of a tractor donated to Bauchi State, Nigeria (18.12.2025).

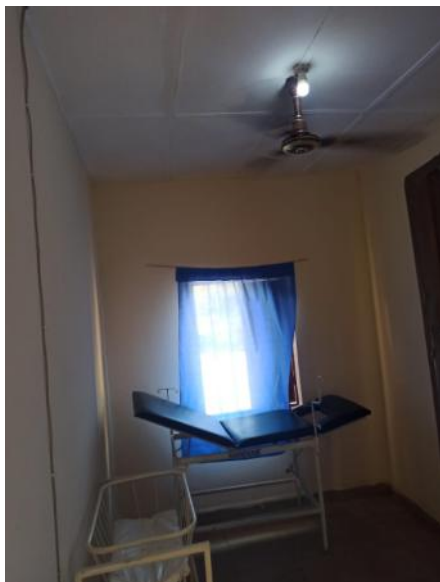


# CONSTRUCTION WORKS

# HUMANITARIAN AID IN GREECE

## **Offer of consumables to hospitals**

Five visits to hospitals were made in order to offer medicines and various consumables (10.2.2025, 4.3.2025, 9.5.2025, 25.9.2025, 22.10.2025).

## **Aid to the school of Second Chance in Larisa (Prison)**

On 15.1.2025, a team of “Heart Doctors” visited the Second Chance School in Larissa prison and offered to the students various items as follows: men's clothing (shirts, t-shirts, pants, socks, scarves, gloves), sportswear - footwear, bedding (pillowcases, sheets, blankets), pajamas, bathrobes, slippers.

Another mission took place (20.1.2025) where they offered various consumables for their needs. On 18.2.2025, “Heart Doctors” team visited again the Second Chance School in Larissa prison and free examination was provided and corrective eyewear was distributed.

## **Aid to the rural clinic in Arkioi, Dodecanese**

“Heart Doctors” team sent to the Rural Medical Center of Arkioi, a small Greek island which is part of the Dodecanese archipelagos, various expendables and a defibrillator as a donation to the Center (11.4.2025, 18.7.2025).

## **Aid to “Estia Constantinople”**

During the year “Heart Doctors” team visited twice the “Estia Constantinople” in Palea Fokea Attiki and handed over various expendables as a donation (12.4.2025, 26.9.2025).

## **Aid to “Infants Center Mother”**

On Monday, 14.4.2025, a team of “Heart Doctors” visited the “Infants Center Mother” in Ilioupoli Attiki and handed over children's footwear and blankets as a donation.

## **Aid to “Lyreio Children's Institution”**

On 4.5.2025, “Heart Doctors” team visited the “Lyreio Children's Institution” in Neos Voutzas area and handed over children's footwear as a donation.

## M E D I C I N E S A N D O T H E R M A T E R I A L

“Heart Doctors” receive from the general public medicines, which are donated for their humanitarian missions. School children, students of foreign languages institutes, the Orthodox Christian Church, various companies and their staff, pharmacies and individuals find the way to offer medicines. Medicines against tropical diseases, which are not produced or marketed in Greece, are purchased from the European market.

Expendable hospital supplies, needed to support provincial hospitals in Greece, are purchased from the Greek market. The same applies to a variety of items offered to natural disaster victims in Greece, to poor families and needy adult school students in prisons. In addition to medicines, “Heart Doctors” use in their missions many other items such as basic foodstuffs (milk powder mainly for children, sugar, wheaten flour, maize, corn flour, corn oil, rice, beans), bottled water, clothing and footwear, bedding items, household equipment, school supplies, mosquito nets. Most of these items are distributed in missions abroad. They are purchased in wholesale markets close to the populations to which they are offered (minimization of transport costs).

In the past, “Heart Doctors” used to collect food items from the general public in Greece; those items were transported to the places of great famine or natural disasters abroad by C-130 planes at the expense of the Greek State.

It is clarified that certain friends of “Heart Doctors”, and volunteer associates, who prefer anonymity, help the work of the Organization by personally participating in the humanitarian missions and covering the cost of buying and distributing the material donated by them.
